

#### PLANS ARE NEARLY COMPLETE FOR THE PSA REGIONAL CONVENTION IN PORTLAND, JUNE 13-16

Two final committee meetings are planned in the six weeks remaining before opening ceremonies to put the finishing touches on the PSA Regional convention to be held in Portland June 13-16, 1991. "For You a Rose in Portland Grows" is the theme of the PSA Regional convention with the event being sponsored by the Columbia Council of Camera Clubs and PSA Cascade Chapter with Frances McElroy, APSA as general chair. The site will be the Holiday Inn-South at Wilsonville. Some of the special events planned are guided field trips, exhibits from PSA's Permanent Print Collection, and the Invitational Color Slide Showcase. Registration costs are \$20.00 for individuals, \$35.00 for couples, and \$10.00 for a single day. \$35.00 is the cost of the Columbia Gorge field trip. See Susie Rydquist for registration forms.

#### ANNUAL BANQUET SET FOR MAY 25
