## **Coming up RIGHT AWAY!**

Trophy winners from last year need to return the objects so that they can be circulated to the new awardees.

1. On June  $1^{st}$  we will be having our <u>Awards Pot Luck</u> at the church.... Start thinking about bringing in these things:

- A. <u>Prints</u> for the End of the year print competition 5 from each category: monochrome – small and large, and color – small and large. Yep that's 20 possible. Deadline is on print night this month, May 18<sup>th</sup>.
- B. <u>Projected Images</u> for the **End of the year competition** film, digital, digital/film (5 of these presented in competition during the year) and medium format (5 of these), autumn landscape entry (3 NOT shown before), remember that the Thelma Locke flower award will be selected from your total entry (so you might want to be sure to include a flower image you have shown during the year).
- C. Images for the <u>President's Theme award</u>. This is a special competition that the President judges, himself. This year he has chosen the theme: "Ice" or "Something in Ice". You may submit three projected images –electronic or film—at any time. Just give them to Rick before the middle of May
