Coming up RIGHT AWAY!

1.) Don Gale will be the featured speaker for the April 4th meeting of **The Nature Photographers of the Pacific Northwest**. The location is Mt. Hood Community College in Gresham. The doors open at 8:30 am, and the presentation starts at 10 with "Techniques for the Landscape Photographer". The afternoon session covers "Macro and Off Camera Flash". Members will also display their prints and electronic images. This is the most economical seminar of the year. (Don will present a half day session on Sunday for Pro-Photo and that one will cost you in excess of \$50.) The fee for NPPNW is \$10 prepaid, or \$15 at the door.... <u>And</u> for that paltry sum you get a good speaker, an audience for your work and as many donuts as you can eat. Plus you meet a lot of folks interested in traveling to great wildlife sites to visit wonderful animals and plants. Hope to see you there. 2.) **Special April Competition.** This is a special night where only these three categories are judged: Spring Landscape competition, Wildlife Competition and the Mini shows. 3.) <u>The President's Theme Award</u> (see page 8 in the Yearbook) is something you might like to think about... It is a special competition that the President judges, himself. This year he has chosen the theme "Ice" or "Something in Ice". You may submit three images – print, electronic or film—at any time. Just give them to Rick before the middle of May.

4.) <u>Multnomah County Fair</u> – Over the weekend of Memorial Day, PPS will host the photographic gallery for the fair. Two things about this, you may enter and submit your prints to the competition and if you win you will get cash prizes. Additionally, Jim Baker will be looking for people to work at the fair for parts of the three days -- He will need people to help hang the show, and some to help take it down, he will need bodies to sit and answer questions during the show (as well as to keep an eye on the fabulous prints). For all this work PPS will receive a stipend that supplements our budget. So, get your prints

ready, volunteer and mark it off on your calendars.... Jim will be seeing you!!! (You can run, but you can't hide – we need YOU.)

1.) Second Monday Seminar March -- Gordon's Seminar challenged us to push the rules of composition.

On March 9th Gordon Battaile gave us a unique slant on composition. He used classical photos, such as Ansel Adam's "Moonlight on Hernandez" and others to show that not all successful images follow the rules. He made points about what good composition can be and he even had the temerity to suggest that not all images needed to be divided into thirds with the subject at one of the "power points"! Break rules if you have to, to show the essence of our images. It was a compelling presentation and he was greatly appreciated. I don't think anyone walked out without having learned something.

2.) Field Trips: Marilyn Pitts has been sending out reviews of previous field trips, and previews of ones to come. Check your E-Mail and sign on. Be sure to look as the images that are being sent your way by the participants... Looks like there are some really good places around here to find images..... (What???
