*Mark Hudon: Mark has sent this description of his work and himself so that you will know what to expect when he gives his presentation. I'm sending it unedited because I think it is a good "leader", come and see the real thing:

"Shape, texture and light are always on my mind when I go looking for photographs. I don't usually want it to be obvious to the viewer what they are looking at. I try to involve the viewer that way. I am always very careful when I frame my photos because I want you to see what I want you to see. If I cut something off it's usually because I want your eye to want to go beyond the edge of the photo wondering what's over there. I'm not a big fan of glorious sunsets from the railing at the edge of the Grand Canyon, to me, that's way too obvious, and besides, its been done millions of times. I'd rather photograph some strange tree and rock on the edge of the Canyon and maybe give you a hint of what's beyond. Someone once described my photography as "photography from the corner of your eye".

I think I may put together a set of the Mark Hudon Greatest Hits. I'll have photos from Washington, Oregon, Utah and Arizona. I think I'll show my "Best of" photos, talk about my theory of photography and touch upon the idea of exposing to the right of your histogram.

My wife, Peggy and I own and run Hood River Coffee Co. a wholesale coffee roaster. We've lived in Hood River for 20 years and have an 11 year old daughter. We moved to Hood River for the windsurfing. Previously I had lived in Lake Tahoe for the rock climbing and skiing. I've owned a camera pretty much all my life but when digital evolved to an acceptable point I started shooting landscapes.

My Mother is a professional artist and in February of 1977 we had a Mother/Son show in New Hampshire, where I was born and where she lives. My mother did her interpretation of eight of my landscape photos. (http://www.markhudonphotography.com/Interpretations.html)

I am 52 years old (I'll be 53 in December), was born in Manchester, NH, moved out west to pursue rock climbing when I was 18, met my wife, Peggy, in Yosemite Nat'l Park in 1976 and have been rock climbing, skiing, windsurfing, Mt Biking, backpacking and taking photographs ever since.
