EXPLORERS OF LIGHT

Our fall meeting will be **November 1** at the Linn-Benton Community College in Albany, OR. We will open the doors at 8:30 AM, and the program will begin at 10 AM. The invited speaker will be **DARRELL GULIN** under the generous sponsorship of **CANON**. His morning presentation is entitled "Creative, Colorful and Conceptual: The Three C's To Successful Photography" and his afternoon presentation is "Nature Photography Across The Globe." Darrell has published in virtually every periodical devoted to nature in North America, and his images have been showcased on every major nature calendar. Check out Darrell's website at gulinphoto.com. CANON will showcase its growing line of photo printers designed for serious nature photographers.

The projected image competition will be exclusively digital. Mail a maximum of four digital files on a CD readable on a Windows PC to Dudley Chelton, 3550 NW Wisteria Pl., Corvallis, OR 97330. Digital files must be in JPEG format and smaller than 10 MB in size. Include a cover letter with a description of the contents of the CD and an email address or phone number so that Dudley can confirm receipt of the files and/or contact you if there are difficulties reading your CD. Digital files must be received by October 24. (Note: If you shoot transparencies exclusively, members of your local camera club will assist you in converting your transparencies to digital files.)

In addition, participants are encouraged to bring a maximum of **two** prints. The prints may be matted but not framed. The total external dimensions (including mat) must not exceed 48 inches (length + width). The categories for the print and the projected image competitions are (1) scenics, (2) wildlife, and (3) plant life. We will again use a "limited hand of man" rule. Any man made object in the entry should not be a major or significant portion of the image.

Take the Interstate 5 exit to Corvallis, Highway 34. Proceed approximately 2.5 miles and exit onto Highway 99E. The exit is marked for Linn-Benton Community College. At the stoplight, turn left. In two miles you will come to Linn-Benton CC on your left. Do **not** turn at the stoplight (Allen Lane) but proceed another half mile to a second stoplight (Ellingson Road) and turn left. At the first opportunity, again turn left into the campus parking lots. We will meet in the Forum on the second level.

For those that wish to arrive on Friday, a block of rooms has been reserved at the Red Lion Hotel in Salem. (Corvallis and Albany are booked for OSU's homecoming.) Please contact the Hotel directly ASAP to reserve a room (800-248-6273). If you identify yourself as a member of the Nature Photographers, you will receive a special rate of \$79.95 plus tax for one or two persons. There are only a limited number of rooms with two beds. The Inn is located on the west side of I 5 at exit 256. If you are coming early, join us for dinner (6 PM) at the Almost Home restaurant across the street from the Hotel.
